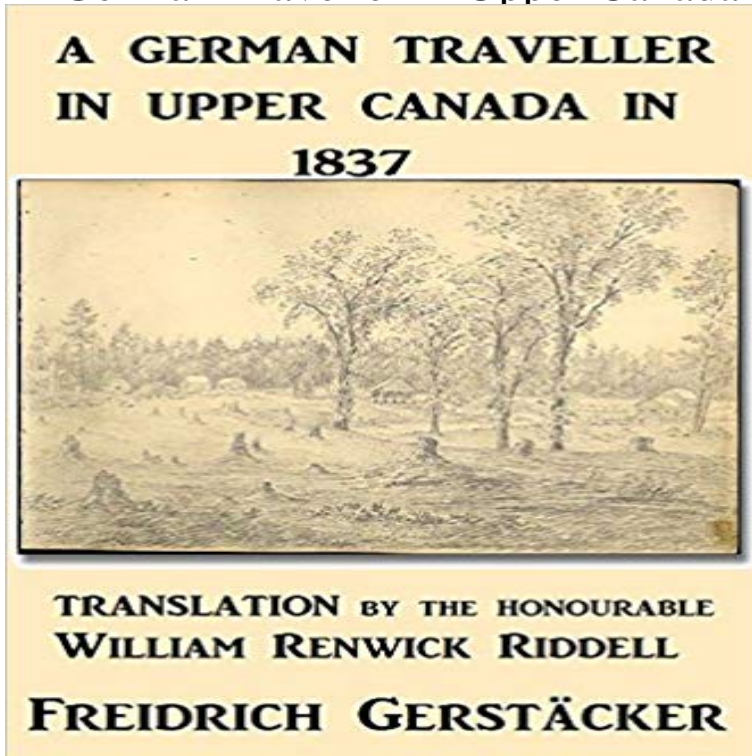


A German Traveller in Upper Canada in 1837



This is a translated excerpt of a book written by German traveller and novelist Freidrich Gerstacker (1816-1872). Born in Hamburg, Germany, Gerstacker sailed across the Atlantic Ocean to North America in 1837. He spent time in New York, then went up the Hudson River, and eventually crossed the border into what was then Upper Canada. Upper Canada, modern-day southern Ontario, was, at that time, still a colony of Britain. It was still largely frontier, with pioneer farmers, forest, wilderness, and many wild animals, such as wolves, deer, ducks, and rabbits. In this excerpt, Gerstacker describes his travels in the area of what are now the towns of Cambridge, Waterloo, and Kitchener. He meets local settlers, farmers, and hunters, including German and American immigrants, and a local indigenous (First Nations) hunter. He survives in the wilderness by hunting wild animals for food. The translation of this excerpt was the work of the Honourable William Renwick Riddell (1852-1945). Riddell was a Canadian lawyer, judge, and historian born near Cobourg, Ontario, several miles east of Toronto. Riddell published several works on Canadian history in his lifetime, including biographies of John Graves Simcoe, the first Governor of Upper Canada (Ontario), and of Canadian novelist William Kirby. Riddell's English language translation of this excerpt of Gerstacker's 1844 memoir *Streif- und Jagdzuge durch die Vereinigten Staaten von Nordamerika* (Rambling and Hunting in the United States of North America) first appeared in the April 1911 edition of the *Canadian Magazine*.
