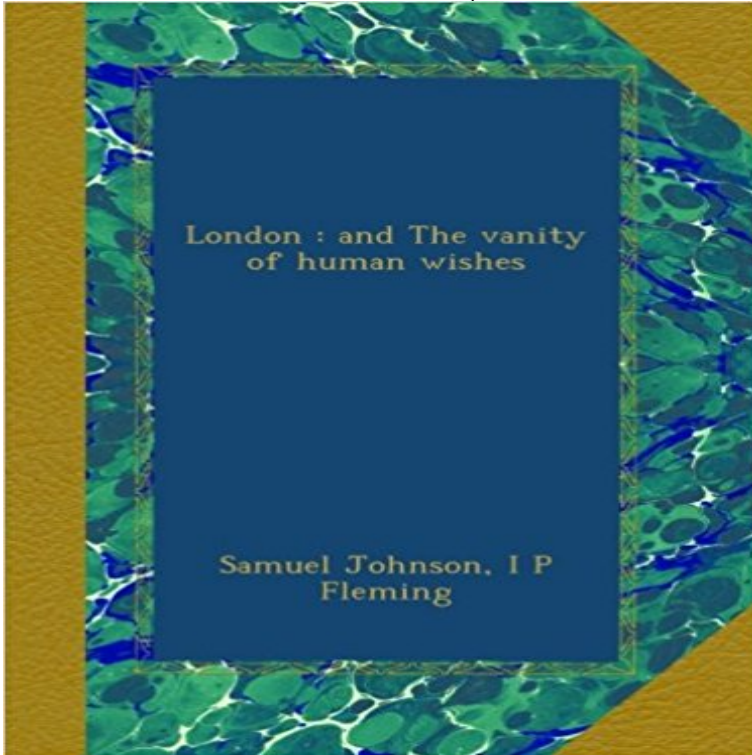


## London : and The vanity of human wishes
