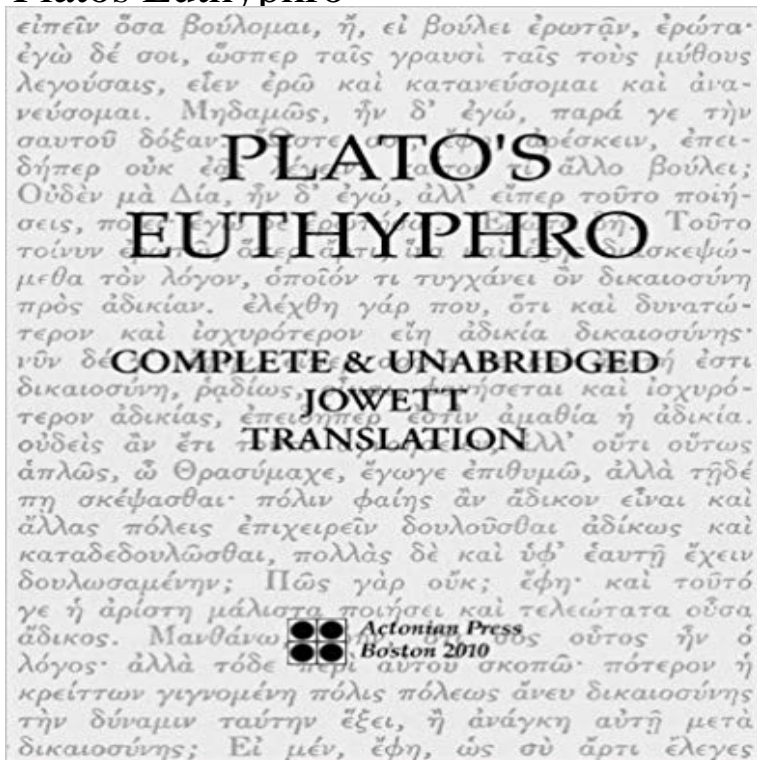


Platos Euthyphro
